### Need to know



#### Pioneering ABC Curriculum Design helps more than 75 modules across UCL

75 modules and six Continuing Professional Development (CPD) courses across UCL have benefited from ABC Curriculum Design, an engaging rapid-develop workshop pioneered by UCL Digital Education.

Clive Young and Nataša Perović developed the workshop to support UCL's transition to a blended campus, where technology supports authentic, creative and collaborative learning that enables a wide range of assessment approaches and augments the face-to-face contact our students value.

Now, UCL Digital Education has been awarded two year Erasmus+ funding to develop the ABC approach with 12 European universities.

#### Call for (teaching) content!

UCL's repository for teaching materials and resources, <a href="OpenEd@UCL">OpenEd@UCL</a>, is in its pilot stages, and the team are keen to connect with UCL staff and students interested in sharing their teaching materials – open educational resources (OER) – online. #### Converting media to accessible formats

UCL staff and students now have access to SensusAccess, a self-service solution that can convert a range of documents to alternative formats, including digital Braille, MP3, DAISY and e-books. The tool complements existing accessibility services usually on offer and can also be used by faculty to convert lecture notes and other content into accessible formats. This guide from Jisc focuses on the elements of learning and assessment design that research dictates are significant in both the higher and further education and skills sectors.

The guide draws on interviews with staff in colleges and universities and a decade of research into technology-enhanced curriculum design, exploring how digital tools can make a difference to the art of learning design.

#### Select a Moodle course format

The **Settings** (Administration) block provides many options to set up your course. Note it has 'cascading' menus, just click on the title next to the arrow to open them.

- 1. Click on **Course administration** to open the menu.
- 2. Click on Edit settings.
- 3. Locate the **Course format** section and choose your preferred format. More information each format and its capabilities can be found in the Moodle Resource Centre.
- 4. Click on Save changes.


#### Questions
