Moodle slow speeds and denied logins

Getting Started with Moodle

An Introduction to Lecturecast

Most of UCL's larger centrally bookable lecture spaces are now equipped with Lecture recording systems. These facilities allow Tutors to book recording of lectures and make them available via the web. These can provide an excellent resource to check students' understanding of content during their lectures and revise towards their exams. This course covers the practical aspects of the recording and publishing cycle and will be useful to tutors who have already booked recordings as well as those who want to to learn more about the service.



Tech focus

You can use the Jisc digital capability discovery tool at UCL from December 2017

UCL will be participating in the beta pilot of the Jisc digital capability discovery tool for staff and students which will run from December 2017 to May 2018.

Users of the tool will respond to a series of questions that allow them to reflect on the digital skills they have already acquired and identify possible new ones. Feedback will include a digital capability profile for respondents and a summarised list of suggested actions.

Questions

I would like to schedule a Lecturecast recording, but I can't find my event(s) on the Lecturecast Scheduler. What do I do?

- Only events timetabled via CMIS can be scheduled for recording. Check to make sure that your lecture is timetabled via CMIS.
- Ensure the lecture is taking place in a <u>Lecturecast enabled teaching room</u>.
- Try searching for any other module codes assigned to your lecture e.g. ECON1001 and ECON1001A as only one code will feed into the scheduler for each event. You could also try doing a search using the 'Location' field.
- Event information is brought into the scheduler on a 3 month rolling basis. Your event will need to occur within the next 3 months to be visible in the Lecturecast Scheduler.
