Need to know

Don't forget to reset your course before the start of term

Resetting you course is the start of the process of preparing your course for use with the next cohort of students. Resetting your Moodle course removes students' work and grades but leaves your course resources or activities in place.

Course resets DO NOT happen automatically. Because of the differences in the way Moodle courses run it is not practical to automate this process. This means that it is the

course owner's responsibility to reset their course.

Live Captioning and Video Subtitling Service Available

Live Captioning for lectures and events is now available using <u>121 Captions</u>, who have been added to uCL's MyFinance system as a service provider. The service allows those with hearing impairments, or with English as a second language, to read along with a speaker, in nearly real-time. The 121 Captions website also includes a number of interesting <u>case studies about working with people who are deaf or hard of hearing</u>.

You can book the number of hours you wish from the company and they will only charge you for these hours. They also offer a video sub-titling service.

- Microsoft Office applications (Word, Excel, Outlook, Access and PowerPoint).
- statistical analysis with SPSS.

Specialist support is offered in the following areas, but is not always available and will depend on the staff on duty, so it is recommended you email in advance:

- statistical analysis (Stata, R).
- web development (HTML & CSS).
- programming (Matlab, Python, Java).
- qualitative analysis software (Nvivo).
- formatting longer documents (LaTeX).

- database design (Access, SQL).
- graphics and image manipulation (Photoshop).
- bibliographic software (EndNote, Reference Manager, Zotero).

All support is on a drop in basis, so it is recommended that you bring some work to do while you wait.



E-Learning Case Study

Using scenarios to get students problem solving

Professor Eva Sorensen explains how Chemical Engineering students tackle six week-long, real-world problem-based scenarios during their first two years as undergraduates, through working in small teams to solve scenarios based on current chemical engineering challenges.



Each team created a video, which were reviewed by secondary school students at ELUTEC, an East London academy sponsored by UCL's Faculty of Engineering. In parallel, the programme team marked the same videos with criteria based on academic evaluation.
